During the day, immerse yourself in the unique history and culture of this northern community and explore the boreal forest, feel the crunch of snow beneath your feet on a snowshoeing adventure, experience the thrill of the wind in your hair with a dog sled team taking you through the forest as the northern landscape stretches out before you, and learn about the rich culture of the region with a tour of the Itsanitaq Museum, where you'll discover the traditions and stories of local Indigenous peoples who have lived in the surrounding region for generations.

DAY 1: WELCOME TO WINNIPEG (MEALS: D)

Guests will arrive into Winnipeg and check into their hotel; Welcome reception hosted by a Frontiers North Interpretive Guide; Overnight at Winnipeg hotel.

DAY 2: YOUR CHURCHILL ADVENTURE BEGINS (MEALS: B, L, D)

Early morning flight to Churchill; Churchill and area tour; Cultural Presentation from a local Indigenous person; Dan's Diner Culinary Experience and northern lights viewing; Overnight at Churchill hotel.

DAY 3: POLAR BEARS INTERNATIONAL & THANADELTHUR LOUNGE (MEALS: B, L, D)

Parks Canada Visitor Centre; Itsanitatq Museum; Polar Bears International House; Evening visit to Thanadelthur Lounge for northern lights viewing; Overnight at Churchill hotel.

DAY 4: SNOWSHOEING AND FOREST EXCURSION (MEALS: B, L, D)

Interpretive Snowshoe Trek and optional Fat Biking; Tundra Buggy® Adventure; Evening Forest Excursion to view the northern lights; Overnight at Churchill hotel.

DAY 5: LAST DAY IN CHURCHILL (MEALS: B, L, D)

Dog Sledding and Interpretive Program; Evening flight to Winnipeg; Check in and overnight at Winnipeg hotel.

DAY 6: DEPART WINNIPEG (MEALS: NONE)

Guests may depart Winnipeg at their leisure.

Included Activities

CHURCHILL AND AREA TOUR: A guided bus tour of Churchill's most notable sites, including the Polar Bear Holding Facility, and Inukshuk.

CULINARY EXPERIENCE: Travel by Tundra Buggy® across the frozen river to Dan's Diner, an exclusive pop-up restaurant in the wilderness.

CULTURAL PRESENTATION: An evening presentation from a local Indigenous Churchill resident about the culture, history, wildlife, and/or lifestyle of Churchill.

DOG SLEDDING: Learn about Métis culture, the history of dog sledding, and enjoy an exhilarating dog sled ride.

FOREST EXCURSION: Escape the lights of town for aurora borealis-viewing opportunities from an extraordinary locale in the boreal forest.

ITSANITATQ MUSEUM: Tour one of Canada's finest Inuit collections dating from pre-Dorset, Dorset, Thule, and modern Inuit times.

PARKS CANADA VISITOR CENTRE: View incredibly detailed wildlife dioramas and fur trade exhibits that represent the history of Churchill.

POLAR BEARS INTERNATIONAL HOUSE: Hear from a Polar Bear International representative and tour the centre to learn about polar bear research and climate change.

ROCKET RANGE: A guided tour of the Churchill Rocket Range National Historic Site - built in 1954 - and learn about its ties to the Canadian Space Agency and NASA. As the first rocket range in Canada, this site was home to extensive suborbital research, including fascinating experiments on the northern lights.

SNOWSHOE TREK: Enjoy the solace of an interpretive snowshoeing adventure through the boreal forest.

THANADELTHUR LOUNGE: Travel by Tundra Buggy® across the river to our warm and secluded lounge for peak aurora-viewing opportunities.

TUNDRA BUGGY® ADVENTURE: Reach remote locales in the wilderness across the frozen Churchill River on board the official Tundra Buggy.
