DAY 1: WELCOME TO WINNIPEG (MEALS: D)

Guests will arrive into Winnipeg and check into their hotel at the Winnipeg airport; Assiniboine Park Conservancy; Welcome reception hosted by a Frontiers North Interpretive Guide; Overnight at Winnipeg hotel.

DAY 2: CHURCHILL ADVENTURE BEGINS (MEALS: B, L, D)

Early morning flight to Churchill; Churchill and area tour; Presentation from beluga whale researcher and marine mammal scientist; Behind the scenes Beluga Boat tour; Overnight at Churchill hotel.

DAY 3: KAYAKING WITH BELUGA WHALES AND MUSEUMS (MEALS: B, L, D)

Morning kayaking with beluga whales; Itsanitaq Museum; Parks Canada Visitor Centre; Overnight at Churchill hotel.

DAY 4: BELUGA WHALE ZODIAC TOUR AND COASTAL HIKE (MEALS: B, L, D)

Beluga Whale Zodiac tour on the Churchill River; Cultural Presentation from a local Churchillian; Churchill Northern Studies Centre; Coastal Hike; Overnight at Churchill hotel.

DAY 5: DOG CARTING, BELUGA WHALES, AND PRINCE OF WALES FORT (MEALS: B, L, D)

Dog Carting and Interpretive Program; Beluga whale viewing and boat tour of the Churchill River; Interpretive walking tour of Prince of Wales Fort; Polar Bears International House; Overnight at Churchill hotel.

DAY 6: TUNDRA BUGGY® ADVENTURE (MEALS: B, L, D)

Tundra Buggy® Adventure in the Churchill Wildlife Management Area; Evening flight to Winnipeg; Overnight at Winnipeg hotel.

DAY 7: DEPART WINNIPEG (MEALS: NONE)

Guests may depart Winnipeg at their leisure.



Included Activities

ASSINIBOINE PARK CONSERVANCY: Visit Winnipeg's Assiniboine Park Conservancy for a behind-the-scenes tour of the Journey to Churchill exhibit.

BELUGA BOAT TOUR: Get a behind-the-scenes tour of the Beluga Boat, a vessel documenting the belugas in the Churchill River.

BELUGA AND FORT TOUR: Discover hundreds of beluga whales by boat and enjoy a guided tour of Prince of Wales Fort National Historic Site.

BELUGA KAYAKING: Get closer to the beluga whales on a kayaking excursion in the Churchill River.

BELUGA ZODIAC: A guided excursion into the Churchill River beluga whale estuary in an inflatable Zodiac boat.

CHURCHILL AND AREA TOUR: A guided bus tour of Churchill's most notable sites, including the Polar Bear Holding Facility, and Inukshuk.

CHURCHILL NORTHERN STUDIES CENTRE: Tour Churchill's independent field station dedicated to the research of the subarctic region, established in 1976.

COASTAL HIKE: Embark on a scenic morning coastal hike to the Churchill Northern Studies Centre.

CULTURAL PRESENTATION: An evening presentation from a local Indigenous Churchill resident about the culture, history, wildlife, and/or lifestyle of Churchill.

DOG CARTING: Learn about Métis culture, the history of dog sledding, and enjoy an exhilarating dog cart ride.

ITSANITAQ MUSEUM: Tour one of Canada's finest Inuit collections dating from pre-Dorset, Dorset, Thule, and modern Inuit times.

PARKS CANADA VISITOR CENTRE: View incredibly detailed wildlife dioramas and fur trade exhibits that represent the history of Churchill.

POLAR BEARS INTERNATIONAL HOUSE: Hear from a Polar Bear International representative and tour the centre to learn about polar bear research and climate change.

TUNDRA BUGGY® ADVENTURE: Search for wild polar bears on a full day Tundra Buggy® adventure in the Churchill Wildlife Management Area.
